- i) **Finding our Path Together – Indigenous Engagement Strategy**
  - Mariette Sutherland, Manager, Indigenous Engagement

M. Sutherland was invited to present the proposed Indigenous Engagement Strategy.

Steps in the Public Health Sudbury & Districts' journey in developing an Indigenous Engagement Strategy reflect the long path public health has been on as we engage with Indigenous peoples and communities. Examples include contributing to provincial Public Health Working Group of the Trilateral First Nations (TFNHSOC), local relationship building meetings with First Nations leaders, internal Indigenous cultural competency training for all PHSD and staff circles, as well as multiple opportunistic program collaborations with First Nations communities fostering front-line staff working relationships. The Board of Health was congratulated for its commitment to strengthening public health programs and services with area First Nations through motions 20-12 and 54-16.

The process and key steps since November 2016 were reviewed and have included communications and information gathering, organizational strengthening, and relationship development components. It was an extensive collaborative process intended to be mutually beneficial, respectful, and strengths-based. It involved the Board of Health, staff from Public Health Sudbury & Districts, Indigenous partners, Elders, and community voices. The process itself was designed to "walk our talk" as part of strengthening relationships.

The proposed strategy in today's Board of Health agenda is the result of a two-year comprehensive information gathering process and reflects what was heard from the Board, the communities and staff engagement processes.

The Strategy includes:

Vision: Working together towards healthy and vibrant Indigenous communities in their pursuit of self-determined health and well-being.

Mission: Public Health Sudbury & Districts works together with area Indigenous Peoples and communities to collaboratively strengthen public health programs and services for all.

Principles: respect, trust, humility.

Strategic directions:

- I. Inform our work through Indigenous community voices and information
- II. Engage in meaningful relationships to support Indigenous community well-being
- III. Strengthen our capacity for a culturally competent workforce
- IV. Advocate and partner to improve health

Next steps following the Board of Health's approval of the Strategy today, will include continuing to work collaboratively to support holistic health and well-being for

Indigenous communities and expanding our efforts to be more inclusive and continually refine our strategy with further engagement with urban First Nation and Métis groups.

Questions and comments were entertained. Board members extended their congratulations at the engagement process and development of the draft strategy. The significance of the design and artwork of the booklet were shared. The booklet design was done by a local Indigenous-led company, Design de Plume. Board of Health members indicated that the draft strategy booklet is overwhelming both visually and for its content and it was recommended that it be distributed widely. The Board was also pleased to see that key sections of the Strategy were translated to Anishnaabemowin, Cree syllabics and Cree translation. M. Sutherland was thanked for her presentation and kudos were extended to M. Sutherland, Director, S. Laclé and team for their valuable contributions to the Indigenous engagement work.

***MOVED BY KIRWAN – PILON: WHEREAS a goal of the Ontario Public Health Standards, 2018 is to decrease health inequities such that everyone has equal opportunities for optimal health; and***

J. Crispo, member of the Joint Board of Health/Staff Accountability Working Group, was invited to provide highlights of the fall 2018 Strategic Priorities: Narrative Report. The Joint Board of Health/Staff Accountability Monitoring Working Group, which includes James Crispo, Carolyn Thain, Nicole Sykes, Dr. Sutcliffe, and other public health staff, is responsible for providing interpretive comments on accountability and monitoring reports, including the narrative reports.

Board members were reminded that the 2018 – 2022 Accountability Monitoring Plan was approved by the Board of Health in June 2018 to serve as an overarching framework for organizational accountability and monitoring.

The 2018 – 2022 Accountability Monitoring Plan reporting process includes short stories, or “narratives”, on how the organization is implementing each one of our four strategic priorities and the narratives are compiled in the Narrative Report. Each year

there will be one such report in the spring and in the fall. The four narratives provide examples of programs or services that show the Public Health Sudbury & Districts Strategic Priorities in action and how the Priorities are integrated into staff members' daily work. They touch on varied topics such as housing investigations, healthy schools, infection prevention and control, and the Public Health *Check Before You Go!* Site. The narrative report will be available in English and in French on the PHSD website.

The next report, which will be presented to the Board of Health in February, will be the Annual Accountability Monitoring Report.

Bill 36, the Cannabis Statute Law Amendment Act, 2018, amends various Acts and enacts one new Act in relation to the use and sale in Ontario of cannabis and of vapour products. Specifically, Bill 36 received Royal Assent on October 17, 2018, and enacts the *Cannabis Licence Act*, 2018 and makes amendments to the *Cannabis Act*, 2017, the *Ontario Cannabis Retail Corporation Act*, 2017 and the *Smoke-Free Ontario Act*, 2017. Legislative highlights include:

- align the prohibition of places of cannabis use (recreational and medical) with those of tobacco smoking and the use of electronic cigarettes (i.e. enclosed workplaces and public places, and other specified places)
- people are permitted to consume cannabis in public if they are not within prohibited areas

- create rules for displaying and promoting vapour products that are separate from the rules for displaying and promoting tobacco products

Bill 36 has implications for the health of the public and for programs and services delivered by local boards of health. Public Health Sudbury & Districts tobacco enforcement officers will be responsible for enforcing cannabis restrictions related to places of use under the Smoke-Free Ontario Act. Staff have completed MOHLTC enforcement training and have been working closely with City of Greater Sudbury and Greater Sudbury Police Services to clarify cannabis enforcement roles and responsibilities and coordinate public messaging.

Proactive work has already taken place on the programming side per the Ontario Public Health Standards. Updates were also shared regarding work that focuses on surveillance, harm reduction, education and awareness, including the setup of a dedicated cannabis information line for the public to call and comprehensive cannabis information on the phsd.ca website and communication with the school boards to ensure they are aware of our role.

While the number of routine inspections under the Smoke-Free Ontario Act, 2017 are not expected to increase significantly compared to work already being done under current legislation, the number of complaints received are expected to increase. It is anticipated that, depending on the appointments of enforcement officers, this routine work can be incorporated in our enforcement approach and budget; however, we will need to monitor and explore one-time funding opportunities.

Speaking points from alPHA regarding the Standing Committee on Social Policy provide additional information.

Questions were entertained. Dr. Sutcliffe confirmed that legislative requirements can be addressed through reallocations within budget for 2018. Dialogue will be pursued with all constituent municipalities within the PHSD catchment area.

Hydro One has approached the United Chiefs and Council of Mnindo Mnising (UCCMM) and they have approved our proposed plan to bury the cable on the shoreline (Please see attached email). Given that the UCCMM does not have any concerns with the underground cable, Hydro One is now seeking approval from the township of Assignack to bury the underground primary cable on the shoreline.

With this in mind, It has been brought to our attention that there has been a new connection request for a customer which is building a house located on Eastview Lane. That being said, Hydro One is now looking at burying additional cable and additional duct for future services along Eastview lane. Given that we are currently going through the approval process and since all the proper equipment will already be on site. We were wondering if we can have approval to bury additional cable and duct for another 180m along the shoreline. Hydro One would like to do this in order to facilitate the process and in efforts to minimize the impact on the shoreline.

Furthermore, you asked for Hydro One to produce a reference plan of the cable location in order for the municipality to keep with their file of the subject property and properties being serviced by this particular cable. Hydro One does not have any objections with providing a reference plan, however we do require to have an easement on the subject property in order to identify the primary underground cable location. Nevertheless, if the township of Assignack does not have any objections with having an easement on the subject property, Hydro One can start the process in order to file an easement and produce a reference plan. Please let me know at your earliest convenience and as always, please let me know if you have any questions or concerns.


Morning Zoe,

The work is planned to take place between November 2018 and February 2019 –pending any discussions UCCMM is interested in having.

The approximate 380 metres of cable and duct proposed for this project is to be buried above the high water mark on the shoreline allowance. Potential sedimentation of the water as a result of this cable burial between the padmount transformers will be prevented by installation of sediment fence between the work site and the water. This excavated material will be placed in a "high & dry" location far enough back from the water line that it cannot re-enter the water. This material will then be spread evenly to promote site stabilization of the shoreline.

The small amount of brush clearing performed by forestry labourers would be using chainsaws and brush cutters. Hydro One lines department would also use a mini-excavator to dig and prepare the trench. The goal is to ensure our primary underground cable installation along the shoreline has a very minimal impact on the environment.

## AMCTO RESPONDS TO ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE BETTER LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT

Dear AMCTO Members:


Last week several municipal reforms with significant ramifications, were put forward by the Honourable Premier Doug Ford and Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing, Steve Clark. While we look forward to reviewing the upcoming legislation, the announcement and several aspects of the proposed legislation has created widespread concern within our sector, regarding timing, implementation, and lack of engagement with local government professionals.

Reserving any specific comment on the policy, AMCTO is concerned with how these reforms were brought forward, notably:

- This legislation will be introduced on the eve of the 2018 municipal elections and will impact provisions within the Municipal Elections Act. AMCTO has long believed that senior orders of government should engage local government professionals and representative associations, early and more importantly, provide the appropriate amount of time to ensure that public policy implementation is effective at the local level. The timing of this legislation will make this extremely challenging.
- This new legislation will create changes to existing election processes within the sector. Ambiguity exists with how to balance the currently enforced rules and regulations with those of the new legislation. Naturally, this ambiguity hinders the ability of local government professionals to implement provincial public policy in a fair and effective manner.
- Finally, AMCTO is concerned that the lack of engagement or notice for these reforms to municipal legislation signals a step backwards in the belief that the municipal sector is recognized as a mature, responsible order of government.

AMCTO staff and members will review the legislation once it is released, and will look for ways to provide our technical expertise on how to support public policy implementation at the local level. We continue to believe this value is best served when our members and association are engaged early in the policy development process.





Dear Municipal Colleague:

This morning, an editorial in the Toronto Star urged AMO to advocate for the City of Toronto, and against Ontario's newly elected provincial government, on the matter of Bill 31 (formerly Bill 5), which reduces the size of Toronto's City Council.

The public debate on the Bill and related use of the 'Notwithstanding Clause' is divided and emotional. The matter confirms that people are passionate about local municipal governance, taxation and public services. It has also put AMO in an awkward position.

The City of Toronto is not an AMO member, and since 2005, the City has made a point of being separate from us. It sought out and secured unique status with the Ontario government, and its own dedicated legislation: *the City of Toronto Act, 2006*. AMO has always respected the City of Toronto's decision to go it alone on governance and the authority of its Act. We certainly defer to the City of Toronto leadership on matters related to its relationship with the Government of Ontario.

Understandably, AMO focuses on service to the remaining 443 Ontario municipal governments that do not have the benefit of their own legislation. Our members have been clear about their top priorities: fiscal sustainability, recognition that one size does not fit all, working with us to improve services, and assurance that the Ontario government will not download its fiscal challenges onto municipal property taxpayers. In every regard, AMO members know that we can achieve far more working together, than we can by going it alone.

In August, we heard that the Province would not act in the same manner that it has with Toronto. We heard that it is committed to discussions with our membership and AMO, to understand what is working and what is not working. And importantly, we heard that consultation would inform future governance reviews. That commitment was repeated in a formal statement to AMO today.


In the four weeks since the conference, we have experienced the following: Minister Clark, a former mayor and former AMO President, is having meaningful discussions with us on long-standing municipal concerns, spanning several ministries. The changes to Toronto's Council have dominated headlines, and over the past week, remarks have suggested that the government is planning to impose further changes on municipal governments across Ontario.

Late last week, I wrote to Minister Clark to emphasize that relations between Ontario's provincial and municipal orders of government should be guided by facts and evidence, rather than by political rhetoric and emotion. His quick response reflects, in part, our shared belief in the benefits of maintaining an open, respectful relationship.

AMO has a clear mandate to ensure that the Government of Ontario benefits from, and experiences, the full weight of Ontario's municipal order of government as we move forward. Our mandate to weigh-in on an issue affecting the City of Toronto is less clear. We recognize growing anxiety across the province. We urge the Ontario government to clearly state its interests in having a governance review, and how it will proceed. And we urge the Ontario government to work with AMO and the municipal order of government to change requirements that undermine municipal finance, infrastructure investment, and efficient service delivery all across Ontario.

This is an important time for AMO and we all have a responsibility to make sure that Ontario's municipal governments are speaking with a strong, clear voice on the priorities that matter most to us all. Our next Board meeting is later this month, and we welcome any input that you wish to share with us as we prepare for it.




